Introduction

Restart Gavar Youth NGO is an independent youth-led organisation based in Gavar, Armenia, founded in 2023. The organisation works to strengthen democratic participation, civic engagement, and youth empowerment at the local and regional levels. Restart Gavar promotes inclusive decision-making, participatory mechanisms, and active citizenship through educational programmes, advocacy initiatives, and community-based projects. Since its establishment, the organisation has implemented over 40 community initiatives, delivered 60 professional development trainings, organised public campaigns, and directly engaged around 500 young people.

With a strong focus on transparency, inclusivity, and democratic values, Restart Gavar actively cooperates with local authorities, civil society organisations, and youth networks to build sustainable community development models. The organisation is also a recognised partner and supporter of the Green Councils Federation in Armenia and is committed to contributing to a stronger, more inclusive youth movement in Eastern Europe and the South Caucasus.

Please briefly present the history of the organisation:

Restart Gavar Youth NGO was established in 2023 in the Gavar community as a result of initiatives addressing the challenges of youth professional orientation and career development. The initial programmes implemented in this field highlighted a structural gap in youth representation and participation at the local level, demonstrating the need for a sustainable youth-led platform to promote civic engagement and democratic involvement. In response, the initiative was institutionalised as a public organisation and began operating as a structured and strategically oriented youth NGO.

Since its establishment, Restart Gavar has focused on strengthening participatory mechanisms and promoting democratic values within the community. While the organisation initially implemented small-scale educational and awareness-raising activities, it rapidly evolved into a recognised and active stakeholder in local youth and community development processes.

To date, the organisation has achieved the following measurable results:

- Established cooperation with 20 civil society organisations, local self-government bodies, and public institutions (formalised through 10 signed Memoranda of Understanding),
- Implemented 40 community-based initiatives,
- Delivered 60 professional development training courses,
- Implemented 15 structured educational programmes,
- Organised 6 public advocacy and awareness campaigns,
- Directly engaged approximately 500 young people.

Restart Gavar’s key strengths include its growing institutional credibility, strong community trust, and commitment to transparency and accountability. These foundations enable the organisation to implement sustainable, impact-oriented programmes and to contribute meaningfully to democratic development at the local level.

The mission of the organisation is to promote youth participation in community decision-making processes and to enhance their educational and cultural engagement as an important component of democratic development in Gavar.

The vision of “Restart Gavar” NGO is to create an active youth community in Gavar and the surrounding regions that actively cooperates with local self-government bodies and contributes to community development by promoting civic engagement.

What is your organisation's motivation to join our Network? How can we contribute to your organisation and how your organisation can contribute to CDN?

Our organisation’s motivation to join the Cooperation and Development Network Eastern Europe (CDN) is rooted in our commitment to democratic development, civic engagement, and sustainable youth empowerment. Restart Gavar’s work focuses on increasing young people’s participation in community decision-making, fostering democratic values, and building active citizenship through educational and cultural initiatives. This aligns closely with CDN’s mission to empower progressive youth organisations and strengthen youth participation in democratic and political processes across Eastern Europe.

For example, we have actively engaged in advocacy and policy work at multiple levels. We have held meetings with the Ministry of Labour and Social Affairs, including direct collaboration with lawmakers, and submitted a full package of proposals addressing gaps and potential reforms in the Law on Volunteer Work. At the local level, we have participated in the discussion and adoption of youth policies in Gavar, contributing to the development of inclusive and participatory frameworks. These experiences have shown the need for our work to extend beyond Gavar, allowing us to address youth advocacy and policy engagement at a regional level. Joining CDN provides an excellent opportunity to share our experience, exchange best practices, and amplify the impact of our advocacy work both in Armenia and across Eastern Europe.



Joining CDN would significantly support our organisational development by providing access to capacity-building opportunities, trainings, seminars, and international networking platforms that enhance our skills in advocacy, policy engagement, and democratic practice. As a network committed to non-formal education, political relevance, and the empowerment of young change-makers, CDN's experience and resources would help us strengthen our organisational structure, expand our outreach, and improve our ability to influence youth participation in governance and community development.

In return, Restart Gavar can actively contribute to CDN's work by bringing our grassroots experience from the South Caucasus region to the Network. Our initiatives in civic education, community leadership, conflict-sensitive communication, and collaboration with local authorities provide valuable insights into youth work in under-represented Eastern European contexts. We can share best practices from our local and regional projects, contribute to joint campaigns, and support CDN's goal of building a stronger, more inclusive Green youth movement across the region. Additionally, our active volunteer network and community partnerships can enrich CDN's diversity of approaches to engaging young people in democratic processes and sustainable development.

Please list (the main) activities of your organisation in the past 2 years:

Since its foundation, Restart Gavar has implemented numerous initiatives to promote democratic values, participatory mechanisms, and active youth engagement in Gavar and beyond. Our work has combined community education, advocacy, public campaigns, and organisational capacity-building. Key activities include:

Formed the Gavar Student Union, bringing together student councils from five educational institutions to collaborate on student issues.

Implemented campaigns to increase public engagement with local parks and raise awareness about volunteering among youth.

Achieved measurable behavioural impact: parents began encouraging their children to participate in volunteer initiatives, demonstrating a growing culture of civic responsibility

Developed foundational documents to ensure transparency, accountability, and proper public representation.

Developed ideas for participatory budgeting in Gavar and won twice at the community level.

Conducted campaigns educating residents on how participatory budgeting works, how to register to vote, and why it benefits the community.

Recognised nationally in Armenia as a leading organisation advocating for participatory budgeting.

Our President, Narek Arevshatyan, was invited to give a TEDx talk on participatory budgeting, titled: *"Youth Engagement Must Be Real, Not Formal"*, highlighting the importance of civic consciousness for genuine community development.



Organised local career and job expos connecting youth with local businesses. Presented current job vacancies and career opportunities to young people. Engaged more than 400 participants, increasing youth awareness of employment pathways and fostering stronger links between education and the local labour market.

Established 20 partnerships with civil society organisations (CSOs), local self-government bodies, and public institutions, formalised through 10 Memoranda of Understanding.

Implemented 40 community initiatives, delivered 60 professional development courses, conducted 15 educational programs, and organised 6 public campaigns engaging approximately 500 young people.

Please, list involvement in CDN and/or FYEG activities in the past 2 years:

Our International Project Coordinator, Nona Hoveyan, participated actively in several CDN initiatives over the past two years, gaining firsthand experience of the Network’s work and values.

In 2024, Nona represented Armenia at the “ReFocus” Summer Camp in Tbilisi, Georgia, engaging with youth from across Eastern Europe on progressive political topics and collaborative initiatives. More recently, in December 2025, she was invited to participate in the CDN Training for Trainers on Non-formal Education and Green and Progressive Politics in Belgrade, Serbia (12–13 December). This training allowed her to deeply engage with the Network’s approach, with a strong focus on inclusive decision-making, youth empowerment, and democratic participation.

During these activities, Nona participated as a Frontline Youth Networks ambassador, representing youth perspectives and building international connections. Now, as part of Restart Gavar, an organisation established in our community with multiple local successes, we aim to bring the values and practices of CDN to a broader regional context. Our organisation strongly aligns with CDN’s mission, sharing both Green values and democratic principles, and we are eager to contribute to and learn from the Network to strengthen youth participation and civic engagement across Armenia and the wider Eastern European region.

Statute

of the “RESTART GAVAR” Youth Public Organization

I.GENERAL PROVISIONS

1. The “RESTART GAVAR” Youth Public Organization (hereinafter referred to as the Organization) is a public association of citizens of the Republic of Armenia, citizens of foreign states, and stateless persons, and has the status of a non-commercial organization.
2. The principles of the Organization’s activities are legality, non-discrimination, good faith, voluntary membership, unity of members’ interests, self-governance, and accountability.
3. The Organization operates throughout the entire territory of the Republic of Armenia and in foreign states, in accordance with the legislation of those states.
4. The name of the Organization is: “RESTART GAVAR” Youth Public Organization.

II.SUBJECT AND OBJECTIVES OF THE ORGANIZATION’S ACTIVITIES

6. The subject and objectives of the Organization’s activities are:
 1. To implement initiatives aimed at improving the quality of education in the Republic of Armenia, particularly in the city of Gavar,
 2. To promote the development of civic awareness among the youth of Gavar,
 3. To encourage the growth of research and academic research skills among youth and students,
 4. To promote academic freedom, academic integrity, and student-centered approaches within the university environment,
 5. To promote the realization of human rights and democratic processes in the Republic of Armenia, particularly in the city of Gavar,
 6. To foster youth engagement and active participation in public activities.
7. In order to achieve its goals and objectives, the Organization cooperates with state and local self-government bodies, international and foreign similar organizations, as well as other organizations registered in the Republic of Armenia.
8. In accordance with its Statute and for the purposes defined therein, the Organization has the right to carry out entrepreneurial activities, to manage its property and the results of its activities, and, in accordance with the law, to establish a commercial organization or become a participant thereof.

III. PROCEDURE FOR BECOMING A MEMBER OF THE ORGANIZATION AND WITHDRAWING FROM MEMBERSHIP

9. Any natural person who has reached the age of 18, accepts the objectives defined in the Organization's Charter, and wishes to participate in its activities may become a member of the Organization.

10. A person wishing to become a member of the Organization shall submit a written application to the Organization's executive body — the President.

11. The decision on admission to membership shall be made by the President on the basis of this Charter.

12. A member of the Organization is free to withdraw from the Organization at any time. Termination of membership shall be effected by a decision of the President.

13. No membership fee is established for members of the Organization.

IV. RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS OF MEMBERS OF THE ORGANIZATION

14. A member of the Organization has the right to:

1. Elect and be elected to the governing bodies of the Organization,
2. Personally attend the Assembly,
3. Use the Organization's services free of charge in all cases,
4. Review the minutes of the Organization's bodies and receive copies of their adopted decisions.
 - 5) To appeal the decisions of the Organization's bodies through a superior body or judicial procedure. An appeal by a member of the Organization against decisions of the executive body shall be carried out by submitting a relevant application to the Assembly. The application shall be examined by the Assembly. The examination of the application may also be conducted remotely.
 - 6) To request information from the Organization and receive copies of documents regarding amendments to the Organization's Statute, minutes and decisions of the Organization's bodies, funds received from the management of property, as well as to receive a copy of the conclusion of the independent auditor who conducted the audit of its financial statements, concerning the last three years.
 - 7) To exercise other rights provided by law.

15. A member of the Organization is obliged to:

1. Comply with the requirements of the Organization's Charter and the decisions of its governing bodies,
2. Conscientiously fulfill the obligations assigned to them by a decision of the governing bodies.

16. In case of violation of the Charter requirements or failure to fulfill the obligations assigned by a decision of the governing bodies, disciplinary measures may be applied to the member by the President of the Organization in the form of a reprimand or expulsion from membership.

V. PROCEDURE FOR THE GOVERNANCE OF THE ORGANIZATION

17. The governing bodies of the Organization are the Assembly and the executive body — the President.

18. The right to make final decisions on any issue related to the Organization's activities belongs to the highest governing body of the Organization — the Assembly.

19. The regular Assembly of the Organization shall be convened once every five years. The regular Assembly shall be convened by the President in the form of a joint meeting of members or in absentia through the use of telecommunication means, with a corresponding record (minutes) prepared. The President determines the date, time, and place of the Assembly, as well as the preliminary agenda, and shall notify the members and structures of the Organization no later than 20 days in advance by registered mail, electronically, through mass media, or by other means prescribed by law.

20. An extraordinary Assembly of the Organization shall be convened by the President at the initiative of the President or at least one-third of the Organization's members.

21. The extraordinary Assembly shall be convened no later than 5 days from the above-mentioned initiative. Participants of the Assembly shall be notified of the time and place of the extraordinary Assembly at least 5 days prior to the date of holding it.

22. The exclusive competence of the Assembly includes:

1. Approval of amendments and supplements to the Statute of the Organization or adoption of the Statute in a new version,
2. Adoption of decisions on establishing another legal entity or on the Organization's participation in another organization,
3. Adoption of decisions on establishing separate subdivisions or institutions of the Organization and approval of their statutes,
4. Approval of the Organizational structure,
5. Election and replacement of the President of the Organization,
6. Determination of the procedure and conditions of remuneration of the President,
7. Election of the person conducting the audit of the Organization, if the Organization is subject to mandatory audit under the law,
8. Approval of the Organization's strategy, if the Organization plans to have one,
9. Once every five years, approval of the annual reports on the Organization's activities and use of property approved by the executive body during the years preceding the convening of the Assembly,
10. Termination of the validity of decisions of the Organization's bodies that contradict legal acts or the Statute,
11. Adoption of a decision on the reorganization of the Organization,
12. Adoption of a decision on the liquidation of the Organization (except in cases of liquidation by court judgment).
13. To exercise of other powers provided for by law.

23. The General Assembly is competent (has quorum) if it has been convened in accordance with the law and the Organization's Statute, and if more than half of the total number of members of the Organization participate in the Assembly. Decisions of the General Assembly are adopted by a simple majority of the votes of the members present at the Assembly.

The minutes of the Assembly are signed by the Chairperson of the meeting and the Secretary. The minutes of the Assembly are kept for 5 years.

24. The President is elected by the General Assembly for a term of five years. The executive body of the Organization is the President. The President manages the current activities of the Organization and conducts the sessions of the General Assembly.

25. The powers of the President include managing the current activities of the Organization, as well as addressing all matters aimed at ensuring the functioning

of the governing bodies of the Organization.

26. In accordance with the Charter of the Organization and the decisions of the General Assembly, the President:

1. ensures the implementation of the decisions of the General Assembly,
2. disposes of and manages the Organization's property of any type and size, including financial resources, and concludes transactions on behalf of the Organization,
3. represents the Organization in the Republic of Armenia and in foreign states,
4. issues powers of attorney,
5. opens settlement (including foreign currency) and other bank accounts for the Organization,
6. within the scope of his/her authority, issues orders and instructions, gives binding directives for execution and supervises their implementation,
7. approves the Organization's staffing schedule and annual expenditure budget,
8. approves internal documents regulating the Organization's activities, including internal disciplinary and other rules of its separate subdivisions and institutions,
9. approves the reports of the Organization as well as of its governing bodies,
10. approves the annual reports on the Organization's activities and use of property for the years preceding the convening of the General Assembly, which are submitted to the General Assembly for approval once every five years,
11. admits members to the Organization and expels members from the Organization,
12. exercises other powers prescribed by law.

27. In exercising his/her powers, the President acts on behalf of the Organization without a power of attorney.

28. The President bears liability as prescribed by law for failure to fulfill or improper fulfillment of the requirements of laws, other legal acts, the Organization's Charter, decisions of the General Assembly, or concluded contracts.

VI. PROPERTY OF THE ORGANIZATION, SOURCES OF FORMATION AND PROCEDURE FOR USE

29. The Organization shall own separate property and shall be liable for its obligations with that property.

30. The Organization may own, as its property, immovable and movable assets, including buildings, constructions, vehicles, equipment, monetary funds, securities, and other property not prohibited by law.

31. The sources for the formation of the Organization's property may include:

1. Contributions of the members of the Organization,
2. Funds received from the Organization's entrepreneurial activities,
3. Funds received from commercial organizations established by it or with its participation,
4. Financial allocations from the state budget,
5. Donations, including grants,
6. Fundraising proceeds,
7. Other means not prohibited by law.

32. The Organization's funds may be used to achieve the goals and objectives defined by the Charter. The Organization's property, including profits derived from entrepreneurial activities, may not be distributed among its members.

VII. REORGANIZATION AND LIQUIDATION OF THE ORGANIZATION, AND THE PROPERTY IN CASE OF LIQUIDATION

USE OF PROPERTY

33. The Organization may be liquidated by a decision of the General Assembly or by a court judgment.

34. The General Assembly shall form a liquidation commission and, in accordance with the procedure prescribed by law, determine the procedure and time limits for liquidation. Upon completion of the liquidation of the Organization, after making the mandatory payments, the liquidation commission shall use the remaining property in accordance with the procedure defined by the decision of the General Assembly for the implementation of the Organization's statutory goals and

objectives, and if this is not possible, transfer it to the state budget.

35. The Organization may be reorganized by a decision of the General Assembly or, in cases prescribed by law, by a court judgment, in accordance with the procedure established by law.

This Charter was drafted on 24.07.2023 and consists of 5 pages.

Statute of the Initiative Group - JUST

Preamble

We are young people from various regions of Georgia who share a common goal and are united by a single aspiration — to live in a green, just, democratic, equal, and solidarity-based society in which every voice is heard.

We take the initiative to establish a youth space where we gather, learn, deliberate, plan, and take action.

Article 1. Vision and Objectives

1. Our vision is to strive for a democratic, sustainable, green, social, feminist, inclusive, and diverse future for all.

2. The objectives of the Initiative Group are:

a) to advocate for environmental protection and for climate, economic and social justice and to implement related initiatives;

b) to promote and protect human rights;

c) to empower minorities and advocate for their rights;

d) to advocate for gender equality;

e) to promote green policies and sustainable practices;

f) to advocate for civic engagement, decentralization, and regional development;

g) to raise awareness among the public and the members.

Article 2. Organizational Structure

The Organization shall consist of the following structural bodies:

a) the General Assembly;

b) the Board;

c) the Executive Director.

Article 3. General Assembly

1. The General Assembly is the supreme governing body of the Organization and shall be convened at least once per year. An extraordinary session of the General Assembly shall be convened by the Board or by one-third (1/3) of the members of the Organization.

The General Assembly shall be deemed duly constituted if more than half of the members of JUST are present or represented at the meeting. In the absence of a quorum, the General Assembly may be reconvened after 30 days.

Members who are unable to attend the meeting in person shall have the right to participate in voting electronically (through online means) and in written form.

2. The Chairperson of the Board shall notify the members of JUST in writing (e.g., by email) of the convening of the General Assembly at least two (2) weeks prior to the meeting.

The notice shall be deemed duly delivered if it is sent to the member's last email address known to the Organization. In the event of a change of email address, the member shall be obliged to promptly inform the Chairperson of the Board thereof.

3. The General Assembly shall adopt decisions by a majority of the votes of the members present, except for matters relating to amendments to the Organization's Charter, which shall require a two-thirds (2/3) majority of the votes of the members present.

Each member shall have one vote. Voting at the General Assembly shall be conducted openly.

4. The General Assembly shall be chaired by the Chairperson of the meeting. The minutes of the meeting shall be signed by the Chairperson and the Secretary of the meeting. They shall be responsible for the accuracy of the minutes.

5. The meetings of the General Assembly shall be recorded in the Register of General Assembly Meetings, the maintenance of which shall be ensured by the Chairperson of the Board.

6. The General Assembly shall:

a) approve the Charter and introduce amendments thereto;

b) elect the Board and decide on the termination of the authority of a Board member in the cases and in accordance with the procedure established by this Charter;

c) hear the reports of the Board;

d) hear and approve the technical and financial reports of the Organization.

Article 4. Board

1. The governing body of the Organization shall be the Board, which shall consist of no fewer than four (4) and no more than seven (7) members, elected by the General Assembly for a term of three (3) years. A member of the Board may be elected for no more than two consecutive terms.

2. The Board shall be convened by the Chairperson of the Board or at the request of two-fifths (2/5) of the Board members and shall meet at least three times per year. Members who are unable to attend a Board meeting in person shall have the right to participate in writing or through online means. In such cases, they shall have the same voting rights as members physically present at the meeting.

3. A Board meeting shall be quorate if attended by a majority of its members — more than half of the total number of Board members. Each Board member shall have one vote. A decision shall be deemed adopted if supported by a majority of the votes of the Board members. In the event of a tie, the vote of the Chairperson of the Board shall be decisive.

4. The Board meeting shall be chaired by the Chairperson of the Board. The minutes of the meeting shall be signed by the Chairperson of the Board and the Secretary. They shall be responsible for the accuracy of the minutes.

5. Board meetings shall be recorded in the Register of Board Meetings, the maintenance of which shall be ensured by the Chairperson of the Board.

6. The Board shall:

a) administer the property of the Organization;

b) elect, from among its members and for the duration of its term of office, the Chairperson of the Board;

c) convene the General Assembly of the Organization;

d) decide on the admission of new members and the expulsion of members;

e) appoint the Executive Director of the Organization and approve their contract, or terminate such contract in the event of a breach of its terms and conditions;

f) approve the Organization's Programmatic Guidelines.

6. Members of the Board shall avoid personal relationships, activities, and financial dealings that could influence the decisions they make in their capacity as Board members. A conflict of interest arises whenever a Board member casts a vote on matters that benefit interests not related to the Organization, such as the business or financial activities of Board members or third parties. In the event that a Board member finds themselves in a situation where a conflict of interest may arise,

they must immediately inform the Chairperson of the Board of the existing or potential conflict of interest and shall refrain from exercising their voting right.

7. The Chairperson of the Board shall convene and preside over the Board meetings.

Article 5. Executive Director

1. The person authorized to manage and represent the Organization shall be the Executive Director. The Executive Director shall be appointed for a term not exceeding three (3) years, with the right of reappointment. If, upon the expiration of such term, the registration of a new term of authority or the registration of a change of the person authorized to manage and represent the Organization is not carried out in accordance with the procedure established by law, the authority of the registered Executive Director shall be deemed extended for an indefinite term.

2. Managerial authority shall mean the power to make decisions on behalf of the Organization within the scope of the granted authority. The Executive Director shall exercise managerial authority in accordance with applicable legislation, this Charter, and the internal regulations.

3. Representative authority shall mean the power to act on behalf of the Organization in relations with third parties. The Executive Director shall have sole representative authority.

4. Within the scope of their authority, the Executive Director shall have the right to conclude transactions on behalf of the Organization, conduct negotiations, appear in court as claimant or defendant, recruit employees to the Organization, enter into employment contracts with them, and decide on personnel matters.

The Executive Director shall be authorized to undertake only those actions that serve the objectives of the Organization and do not cause it harm. The Executive Director shall be obliged to manage the affairs of the Organization lawfully and in good faith. In the event of failure to perform their duties, the Executive Director shall be liable to the Organization for any damage incurred. A waiver of a claim for damages shall be void if such waiver is necessary to satisfy claims of third parties.

The managerial authority of the Executive Director shall be limited by the competences assigned under this Charter to the General Assembly and the Board.

5. The Board may dismiss the Executive Director at any time without stating grounds.

6. The Executive Director shall have the right to resign from office. In such case, the Director shall comply with the requirements and procedures established by the employment contract concluded with the Organization and by applicable legislation.

7. The Executive Director shall be obliged to submit to the General Assembly, once per year, a report on the activities of the Organization.

Article 6. Rights and Obligations of Members

1. Any person who shares the objectives and goals of the Organization may become a member of the Organization.

2. Admission to membership, withdrawal, and expulsion shall be decided by the Board.

3. Membership in the Organization shall be terminated in the following cases:

a) on the basis of a personal written application;

b) upon expulsion from the Organization.

4. By decision of the Board, a member may be expelled from the Organization if they systematically violate the rights and obligations imposed upon them under this Charter or if, through their actions, they act contrary to the activities, objectives, and goals of the Organization.

5. A member shall have the right:

a) to be elected to the governing and/or other bodies of the Organization;

b) to participate in the programs, projects, ongoing activities, and other events of the Organization;

c) to receive information regarding the activities of the Organization and to have access to information maintained by the Organization;

d) to withdraw from membership.

6. A member of the Organization shall be obliged:

a) to comply with the Charter and internal regulations of the Organization;

b) to safeguard the name, professional reputation, and property of the Organization;

c) to pay the membership fee within the time limit established by the Organization (if applicable).

Article 7. Transitional Provisions

1. This Charter constitutes a founding agreement concluded among the founders of the Organization, expressing their mutual and concordant will, and shall be binding upon the founders and the members.

2. With the support of more than half of the members of the Board, the Initiative Group shall, by the end of 2026, be registered as a Non-Entrepreneurial (Non-Commercial) Legal Entity (NNLE) in accordance with the legislation of Georgia.

Please briefly present the history of the organisation:

We were founded out of a collective need to create spaces in which young people could meaningfully influence educational policies and, at the same time, directly intervene through alternative educational practices. Before the formal establishment of the Critical Education Centre (CKO), two grassroots initiatives laid the foundation for our work.

The first was the creation of the web journal *BalkanTalks*, which emerged spontaneously from students participating in the Balkan Courses within CEU's Invisible University for Ukraine (IUU). The platform was established to address the lack of spaces in the Balkans where young people could authentically articulate their political positions and critical reflections on the social realities surrounding them. It quickly became a youth-led space for analysis, commentary, and regional dialogue.

The second initiative was the launch of the *Underground Festival*, created in response to the absence of local spaces where young people could create and communicate through music and visual arts. The festival provided a platform for artistic expression, critical engagement, and community-building, enabling young artists to publicly present their perspectives and concerns.

In the summer of 2024, we brought together the young people who had initiated these two projects and collectively decided to formally register an organization that would systematically provide spaces for youth critique, critical education, and a culture of questioning. Shortly after its official registration, CKO began operating in a more structured and program oriented way.

BalkanTalks continued to expand its editorial and mentoring work, while *Underground* grew into a recurring cultural platform organizing festivals, concerts, exhibitions, and publishing music compilations. In addition, following our formal establishment, we launched three key program pillars: the Program for the Feminization of Formal Education, the Transitional Justice Program, and the Climate Justice Program. Each of these programs includes workshops, lectures, and other non-formal educational practices, alongside the development of policy papers, publications, and advocacy campaigns aimed at promoting their adoption and implementation.

Члан 1.

Удружење Центар за критичко образовање (у даљем тексту: Удружење) је добровољно, невладино, нестраначко и непрофитно удружење засновано на принципима слободе удруживања и начелу једнакости грађана и грађанки. Члан 9.

Начела на којима почива Удружење су: људска права, једнакост, слобода, солидарност и родна равноправност.

Члан 10.

Удружење се у свом деловању залаже за следеће циљеве:

1. Образовање и информисање грађана и грађанки са посебним фокусом на младе;
2. Научно-истраживачки рад са циљем критичке анализе друштвених процеса и појава;
3. Заговарање законских решења која унапређују друштвену правду и родну равноправност;

V УНУТРАШЊА ОРГАНИЗАЦИЈА И ОРГАНИ УДРУЖЕЊА

Члан 13.

Органи Удружења су Скупштина и Председник/ца удружења.

Члан 14.

Скупштина је највиши орган Удружења.

Скупштину чине сви чланови и чланице Удружења.

Редовно заседање Скупштине одржава се једном годишње.

Ванредно заседање Скупштине се по потреби може одржавати и у краћим временским интервалима.

Годишњи обрачун и извештаји о активностима Удружења подnose се члановима и чланицама на седници Скупштине.

Члан 19.

Члан/ица Скупштине Удружења може бити свако лице које прихвата циљеве и Статут и поднесе пријаву за учлањивање Председнику/ци удружења.

Малолетно лице са навршених 14 година живота може се учланити у Удружење уз прилагање оверене изјаве његовог законског заступника о давању сагласности.

За лице млађе од 18 година, из става 1. овог члана, пријаву подноси његов законски заступник.

Члан 20.

Статус члана/ице Скупштине стиче се оснивањем или накнадним приступањем Удружењу, на начин и под условима прописаним Законом и овим Статутом.

Члан 23.

Удружење прибавља средства од добровољних прилога, донација и поклона, финансијских субвенција и на други законом дозвољен начин.

Удружење може прибављати средства и од котизације за семинаре и продаје производа из свог издаваштва.

Удружење прибавља средства обављајући привредну делатност: 7022, Консултантске активности у вези са пословањем и осталим управљањем.

Удружење може почети са непосредним обављањем ове делатности тек након извршеног уписа у Регистар привредних субјеката.

Добит остварена на начин из става 3. овог члана може се користити искључиво за остваривање циљева удружења, укључујући и трошкове редовног рада Удружења и сопствено учешће у финансирању одређених пројеката.

Члан 24.

Имовина Удружења се може користити само за остваривање његових, Статутом одређених, циљева и не може се делити његовим члановима, оснивачима, запосленим и са њима повезаним лицима, што се не односи на давање пригодних награда и накнада оправданих трошкова насталих остваривањем статутарних циљева Удружења (путни трошкови, дневнице, трошкови преноћишта и слично), уговорне теретне обавезе и исплату зарада запосленима.

Члан 25.

Based on the Law on Associations of the Republic of Serbia (“Official Gazette of the RS”, No. 51/2009, 99/2011 – other laws, and 44/2018 – other law), the Assembly of the Association Center for Critical Education, on 2 August 2024, adopted the following:

**STATUTE
OF THE ASSOCIATION CRITICAL EDUCATION CENTRE**

I BASIC PROVISIONS

Article 1

The Association Critical Education Centre (hereinafter: the Association) is a voluntary, non-governmental, non-partisan, and non-profit association founded on the principles of freedom of association and equality of citizens. The Association is established for the purpose of achieving objectives in the field of improving educational policies, scientific research and educational activities, cultural and artistic production, and activism, with the aim of affirming concepts and practices of equality, women’s and minority rights, social justice, and solidarity.

Article 2

The Association is established for an indefinite period. It organizes itself freely and independently in pursuing its objectives.

Article 3

The Association acquires legal personality on the day of its registration in the official register.

Article 4

The work of the Association is public and regulated by this Statute.

Article 5

The Association may join alliances and other associations in the country and abroad.

Article 6

For more efficient operations, the Association may establish sections, branches, and groups that do not have legal personality.

II NAME AND REGISTERED OFFICE

Article 7

The name of the Association is “Center for Critical Education.” The abbreviated name is “CKO.”

The name of the Association in English is “Critical Education Centre.”

Article 8

The registered office of the Association is Braće Kovač 66B/16, Voždovac, Belgrade.

III AREA OF ACHIEVING OBJECTIVES

Article 9

The principles on which the Association is founded are: human rights, equality, freedom, solidarity, and gender equality.

Article 10

In its activities, the Association advocates for the following objectives:

- Education and information of citizens, with special focus on youth;
- Scientific research aimed at critically analyzing social processes and phenomena;
- Advocacy for legal solutions that promote social justice and gender equality;
- Advancement and promotion of women's and other minority rights;
- Encouraging and empowering youth for activism, creativity, and artistic expression;
- Creating a safe space for members of minority groups;
- Zero tolerance for discrimination based on sex, gender, race, sexuality, ethnic or national background, or religion;
- Other related objectives.

Article 11

For the purpose of achieving its objectives, the Association shall in particular:

- Provide theoretical education and practical training to various social groups, organizations, and individuals, with special focus on youth, enabling them to independently exercise their rights and political freedoms;
- Collect and process scientific and professional literature in the field of social theory addressing critical pedagogy, social equality, democracy, gender equality, social justice, and political freedoms;
- Organize, independently or in cooperation with other organizations, conferences, consultations, seminars, schools, trainings, and other forms of education in these fields;
- Publish books and other publications in accordance with the law;
- Cooperate with universities, schools, professional associations, and other organizations in the country and abroad;
- Cooperate with experts engaged in education and training in the relevant fields;
- Build a broad network of individuals, institutions, groups, and organizations;
- Provide legal counselling in the areas of educational policies, human rights, and gender equality in cooperation with professionals;
- Undertake other activities.

IV SEAL

Article 12

The Association has a round seal bearing the inscription "CENTER FOR CRITICAL EDUCATION" along the edge, with the Association's logo in the center.

V INTERNAL ORGANIZATION AND BODIES

Article 13

The bodies of the Association are the Assembly and the President.

Article 14

The Assembly is the highest body of the Association.

It consists of all members.

Regular sessions are held once per year.

Extraordinary sessions may be held as needed.

An extraordinary session may be convened at the initiative of at least one third of members or at the initiative of the President.

The session is convened by the President through written notice specifying the place, time, and proposed agenda.

An extraordinary session must be held within 15 days of the request.

Article 15

The Assembly:

- Adopts work plans and programs;
- Adopts the Statute and its amendments;
- Adopts other general acts;
- Elects and dismisses the President;
- Reviews and adopts annual reports;
- Reviews and adopts financial plans and reports;
- Decides on status changes and termination;
- Decides on joining alliances;
- Decides on admission and exclusion of members;
- Decides on the Association's symbol.

The Assembly validly decides if at least half of the membership is present.

Decisions are adopted by majority vote of those present.

Amendments to the Statute, status changes, termination, and property matters require a two-thirds majority of those present.

Article 16

The President is the responsible person of the Association.
The President is elected by the Assembly by majority vote.
The mandate lasts three years and may be renewed.

Article 17

The President:

- Manages the Association between Assembly sessions;
- Organizes regular activities;
- Delegates tasks;
- Makes financial decisions;
- Initiates amendments to the Statute;
- Initiates legal procedures if necessary;
- Establishes committees;
- Prepares work plans;
- Submits annual reports;
- Establishes editorial boards and appoints the editor-in-chief;
- Decides on membership fees;
- Decides on other matters not assigned to other bodies.

VI PUBLICITY

Article 18

The work of the Association is public.
The President ensures regular information of members and the public.
Annual financial reports are submitted to the Assembly.

VII MEMBERSHIP

Article 19

Any person who accepts the objectives and the Statute may become a member by submitting an application.

A minor aged 14 or above may join with notarized parental consent.

For persons under 18, the application is submitted by the legal guardian.

Article 20

Membership is acquired by founding or subsequent accession under the conditions prescribed by law and this Statute.

New members have equal status as founders.

For persons under 14, the guardian submits the statement.

Article 21

The Assembly decides on admission and informs the applicant.

The Association keeps a membership register.

Membership may cease by resignation, prolonged inactivity, violation of the Statute, or damage to the Association's reputation.

The Assembly decides on termination of membership.

The member must be given the opportunity to respond before termination.

VIII RIGHTS AND OBLIGATIONS

Article 22

Members have the right to:

- Participate equally in achieving objectives;
- Participate in decision-making;
- Elect and be elected;
- Be informed.

Members are obliged to:

- Contribute actively to objectives;
- Participate in activities;
- Perform tasks assigned by the President.

IX FINANCIAL RESOURCES

Article 23

The Association acquires funds from donations, gifts, subsidies, and other lawful sources.

It may also collect seminar fees and sell publications.

It may engage in economic activity 7022 – Management consultancy activities.

Profit may only be used for achieving statutory objectives.

Article 24

The Association's property may only be used for achieving its objectives and may not be distributed to members, except for justified expenses and salaries in accordance with the law.

Article 25

In case of termination, the property shall be transferred to a domestic legal entity with similar objectives, as decided by the Assembly in accordance with the law.

Article 26

The Association ceases to exist by Assembly decision or in other cases provided by law.

Article 27

Matters not regulated by this Statute shall be governed directly by the Law on Associations.

Article 28

This Statute enters into force on the day of its adoption at the Founding Assembly and shall apply from the date of registration.

Based on Article 15 of the Statute of the Association “Center for Critical Education,” which stipulates that the Assembly adopts the general acts of the Association, the Assembly of the Center for Critical Education, registration number: 28384289, tax identification number (PIB): 114543840, at its regular session held on 10 August 2025, hereby adopts the following:

RULEBOOK ON THE WORK OF THE ASSEMBLY OF THE CRITICAL EDUCATION CENTRE

I BASIC PROVISIONS

Article 1

This Rulebook regulates the manner of work of the Assembly of the Association “Critical Education Centre” (hereinafter: the Association), the decision-making procedure, the manner of convening and conducting sessions, as well as the establishment of working and program bodies.

Article 2

The Assembly is the highest governing body of the Association, in accordance with the Statute of the Association.

II COMPOSITION OF THE ASSEMBLY

Article 3

The Assembly consists of all members of the Association in accordance with the Statute.

Article 4

Members up to the age of 35 have the right to vote in the Assembly.

Members older than 35 may join the Association and equally participate in discussions, propose initiatives, and be part of working and program bodies, but they do not have the right to vote in the decision-making process.

Article 5

All members, regardless of voting rights, have the right to participate in discussions, submit proposals, and initiate initiatives.

III METHOD OF WORK AND DECISION-MAKING

Article 6

The Assembly operates in accordance with the principles of direct democracy.

Decisions are adopted by direct vote of the members present who have voting rights.

Article 7

The Assembly decides according to the principle of a sliding quorum.

Any member may exclude themselves from the quorum by submitting a written statement at least 24 hours prior to the Assembly session if they are unable to attend.

A quorum exists if, at the beginning of the session, at least one third of members with voting rights (excluding those who have formally excused themselves) are present.

If the number of members present varies during the session, decisions are adopted by a majority vote of the members with voting rights present at the time of voting.

Article 8

All Assembly decisions are adopted by a majority vote of the members with voting rights present, except in cases where special majorities are required, as defined in Article 9 of this Rulebook.

Article 9

Special majorities apply to the following decisions:

The decision on the termination of the Association's work shall be adopted by consensus of all members with voting rights.

The decision on the election of the legal representative (President) shall be adopted by a two-thirds majority of all members with voting rights.

IV ASSEMBLY SESSIONS

Article 10

Assembly sessions may be regular or extraordinary, in accordance with the Statute.

Article 11

A regular Assembly session is convened by the President of the Association.

An extraordinary Assembly session may be convened by any member of the Association.

The President or other person convening the session is obliged to timely inform the membership of the place, time, and proposed agenda.

Article 12

The session is chaired by a person elected by the Assembly through a public vote at the beginning of the session.

Article 13

Minutes shall be kept of the Assembly's work and shall include:

- date and place of the session,
- list of attendees,

- agenda,
- summary of discussions,
- adopted decisions and voting results.

The minutes shall be delivered to all members within three days after the session.

V WORKING GROUPS AND PROGRAMS

Article 14

The Assembly may establish:

- Working groups – as temporary bodies for the implementation of specific tasks, projects, or initiatives.
- Programs – as permanent sub-bodies of the Assembly within thematic or strategic areas of the Association’s activities.

Article 15

The decision establishing a working group or program shall define:

- its objective and mandate,
- duration (in the case of working groups),
- coordinator,
- method of reporting to the Assembly.

All bodies are accountable to the Assembly and shall submit reports on their work.

VI RELATION BETWEEN THE ASSEMBLY AND THE PRESIDENT

Article 16

In addition to the Assembly, the Association has a President, who serves as the legal representative.

Article 17

The President:

- organizes and convenes regular Assembly sessions,
- ensures the implementation of Assembly decisions,
- regularly informs the membership about the work of the Association.

The President may not independently adopt decisions that fall within the competence of the Assembly.

All strategic, programmatic, and organizational decisions are adopted exclusively by the Assembly.

VII PUBLICITY AND TRANSPARENCY

Article 18

The work of the Assembly is public.

Decisions and minutes are published internally to the membership and, where appropriate, publicly, in accordance with the Statute and the principle of transparency.

VIII FINAL PROVISIONS

Article 19

This Rulebook enters into force on the day of its adoption at the Assembly session.

Please briefly present the history of the organisation:

The history of İklim Öncüleri (Climate Pioneers) is characterized by its rapid growth from a grassroots youth initiative into a significant national movement in Turkey. The organization was officially founded on September 1, 2021, by a group of children and young activists. It was established as a national movement to unite high school and university students across Turkey to take collective action against the climate crisis in a safe and non-hierarchical environment. From its inception, the initiative prioritized scientific accuracy, artistic expression, and the mental well-being of its volunteers. It adopted a unique "Period System" (quarterly cycles) to manage its activities and volunteer rotations effectively. Rooted in the principles of non-violence, inclusivity, and non-hierarchical organization, Climate Pioneers provides a safe space for youth to develop innovative projects, startups, and advocacy campaigns. Climate Pioneers (İklim Öncüleri) operates under a horizontal hierarchy and a decentralized organizational structure that prioritizes youth leadership and collective decision-making. The statutory bodies and core units of the initiative are as follows:

GENERAL PROVISIONS

1.1. The non-governmental organization "SATELLITE" (hereinafter referred to as the Organization) is a voluntary association of individuals established to exercise and protect human and civil rights and freedoms to satisfy public, in particular, economic, social, cultural, educational, and other interests of its members and/or other persons.

1.2. Name of the Organization:

full name — public organization "SATELLITE"

abbreviated — NGO "SATELLITE"

1.3. Name of the Organization in English:

full name — "SATELLITE"

abbreviated — "SATELLITE"

1.4. In its activities, the Organization shall be guided by the Constitution of Ukraine, the Civil Code of Ukraine, the Tax Code of Ukraine, the Law of Ukraine "On Public Associations", the Law of Ukraine "On State Registration of Legal Entities, Individual Entrepreneurs and Public Organizations", other applicable laws of Ukraine and this Statute. The legal basis for the Organization's activities is also the regulatory documents and general decisions adopted by the Organization within their statutory powers and binding on all members.

1.5. The Organization is a non-entrepreneurial, non-profit company whose main purpose is not to make a profit. The Organization is free to choose its activities and acts on the principles of voluntariness, self-government, free choice of the territory of activity, equality before the law, absence of property interests of its members, transparency, openness, and publicity.

LEGAL STATUS OF THE ORGANIZATION

2.1. The activities of the Organization are of a public nature, which is manifested in its interaction with state authorities, local governments, enterprises, institutions, organizations of various forms of ownership, establishing partnerships with other public organizations, movements, and foundations registered in Ukraine or abroad, citizens of Ukraine, foreigners and/or stateless persons.

2.2. The Organization acquires the status of a legal entity from the moment of its state registration in accordance with the current legislation and has its own seal, stamps, and letterheads with its name and accounts in banking institutions. The Organization may have its own symbols (emblem, flag), which are subject to registration in accordance with the procedure established by law.

2.3. From the moment of state registration, the Organization shall have the exclusive right to use its name, including the name in a foreign language or a language of a national minority.

2.4. In order to achieve its purpose and fulfill its statutory tasks, the Organization shall have the right, in accordance with the procedure established by the current legislation

2.4.1. Be a party to civil law relations to acquire property and non-property rights in accordance with the law.

2.4.2. Represent and protect its legitimate interests and the legitimate interests of its members or other persons in any public authorities, including courts, law enforcement agencies, local governments, enterprises, institutions, and organizations of all forms of ownership and subordination.

2.4.3. Freely disseminate information about its activities to promote its purpose and goals.

2.4.4. Support other associations of citizens ideologically and organizationally to assist in their creation and conduct of their activities.

2.4.5. Publish scientific and methodological results of the Organization's activities to conduct information and explanatory work.

- 2.4.6. Receive, in the manner prescribed by law, public information in the possession of public authorities and other public information managers.
- 2.4.7. Participate in the Organization and financing, as well as independently conduct conferences, seminars, competitions, lectures, round tables, consultations, creative events, tournaments, contests, and other events related to the statutory activities of the Organization, with the involvement of representatives of the public, state and local authorities, experts from various fields of public life, including international ones.
- 2.4.8. Receive assistance in the form of funds or property received free of charge in the form of membership fees, non-refundable financial assistance, donations, or grants, and independently decide on their use by the provisions of this Statute and the legislation of Ukraine.
- 2.4.9. Carry out, following the procedure provided for by the current legislation, the necessary business activities directly or through the establishment of legal entities (companies, enterprises) following the procedure provided by law if such activities are consistent with the purpose (purposes) of the Organization and contribute to its achievement.
- 2.4.10. Participate in the implementation of the state regulatory policy by the legislation of Ukraine.
- 2.4.11. Apply in the manner prescribed by law to state authorities, local governments, their officials, and employees with proposals (comments), applications (petitions), and complaints.
- 2.4.12. Receive, in the manner prescribed by law, public information that is necessary for realizing its goals and objectives, which is in the possession of public authorities and other public information managers.
- 2.4.13. Participate in following the procedure established by law in developing draft regulations issued by state authorities and local self-government bodies and relating to the scope of the Organization's activities and important issues of state and public life.
- 2.4.14. Participate, following the procedure established by law, in the work of advisory, consultative, and other subsidiary bodies established by state authorities, authorities of the Autonomous Republic of Crimea, and local self-government bodies for consultations with public associations and preparation of recommendations on issues related to the field of activity of the Organization.
- 2.4.15. Maintain direct international contacts with organizations of citizens of other countries, conclude relevant agreements, and participate in international events on the activities of the Organization that do not contradict Ukraine's international obligations.
- 2.4.16. Create and implement various projects and programs.
- 2.4.17. Participate on a voluntary basis or establish public unions, including international ones, and conclude agreements on cooperation and mutual assistance.
- 2.4.18. Receive on a lease or temporary free-use basis buildings, equipment, vehicles, and other property necessary for the implementation of the statutory tasks of the Organization.
- 2.4.19. Open accounts in national and foreign currencies in banking institutions.
- 2.4.20. Establish awards to recognize members of the Organization and its partners.
- 2.4.21. Directly or through legal entities (companies, enterprises) established by it, be the executor of the state order following the law.
- 2.4.22. Exercise other rights provided for by the legislation of Ukraine.
- 2.5. The Organization shall be liable for its obligations with its property. The Organization shall not be liable for the obligations of its members, and its members shall not be liable for the obligations of the Organization, except in cases where they assume such obligations.

PURPOSE AND AREAS OF ACTIVITY

3.1. The main goal of the Organization is to promote the formation of a safe, educated, socially conscious, morally and culturally developed society in Ukraine, to ensure the acquisition of new knowledge, expand the educational horizons of young people, gain intercultural and intersectional experience and other educational interests. Promoting the ideas of non-formal

education and learning through the exchange of expertise among Ukrainian and international youth, as well as empowering young people and helping them develop basic soft skills.

3.2. The primary activities of the Organization are:

3.2.1. Preparing and conducting informational, educational seminars, training, festivals, sessions, and other group events, providing and providing consultations to community residents, youth, and different population segments.

3.2.2. Developing educational programs for young people aged 16-30 aimed at leadership, tolerance, cultural promotion, social integration, and media literacy.

3.2.3. Development of youth exchange programs between young people of Ukraine and young people from other countries to eliminate stereotypes and develop multicultural dialogue and cooperation.

3.2.4. Create information, analytical, training, and consulting activities for educational work with target audiences.

3.2.5. Cooperation with state and international structures, local governments, territorial communities, international organizations, and other citizen associations within the Organization's purpose framework.

3.2.6. Developing and implementing international exchange programs for representatives of various professional groups (trainers, teachers, journalists, civil servants, business people, etc.) and their international colleagues to exchange ideas and develop cooperation.

3.2.7. Promoting moral and ethical values in the society.

3.2.8. Providing opportunities for youth mobility for youth, youth workers, and employees of public organizations.

3.2.9. Organizing informal youth exchanges for Ukrainian youth aged 16-30 in the countries of Europe and the Eastern Partnership.

3.2.10. Conducting training courses on non-formal education methods for youth workers, volunteers, and employees of public organizations without age restrictions.

3.2.11. Promoting the development and dissemination of non-formal education ideas.

3.2.12. Empower young people and help them develop basic skills.

3.2.13. Develop and consolidate business and social cooperation of the Public Organization with other state, public, and other organizations located both on the territory of Ukraine and foreign and international institutions and organizations based on equality and non-interference in internal affairs contractually.

3.2.14. Volunteer activities aim to comprehensively support community residents, student communities, and partner non-governmental organizations.

3.2.15. Carrying out international activities in the manner prescribed by the Statute of the Public Organization and the current legislation of Ukraine.

3.2.16. Conducting and engaging in long-term capacity-building projects for local NGOs and partner institutions to strengthen their capacity and joint growth.

3.2.17. Execute state orders following the current legislation and carry out project activities to comprehensively support community life following the procedure established by the current legislation.

PROCEDURE FOR ACQUIRING AND TERMINATING MEMBERSHIP, RIGHTS, AND OBLIGATIONS OF MEMBERS OF THE ORGANIZATION

4.1 Membership in the Organization is voluntary and individual.

4.2 Members of the Organization may be citizens of Ukraine, foreigners, and stateless persons who are legally in Ukraine, who have reached the age of 14, and who recognize the Statute of the Organization and promote activities aimed at achieving the goals and objectives of the Organization.

4.3. No one shall be forced to join the Organization. Membership or non-membership in the Organization shall not be grounds for limiting the rights and freedoms of any person or for

granting any benefits and advantages to him/her by public authorities, other state bodies, or local self-government bodies.

4.4. Admission to membership in the Organization is carried out based on a written application addressed to the Chairman of the Board by the decision of the Board of the Organization, which is taken within one month from the date of submission of the relevant application. The Board of the Organization has the right to refuse to admit a person to membership in the Organization. The Board of the Organization has the right to delegate the right to admit to membership to separate divisions of the Organization or other statutory bodies.

4.5. All members of the Organization shall be equal in exercising their rights and obligations.

4.5.1. The rights of a member of the Organization include:

4.5.1.1. to elect and be elected to the governing bodies of the Organization, to participate in all events held by the Organization;

4.5.1.2. to participate in the work of permanent and temporary commissions established by the decision of the authorized bodies of the Organization;

4.5.1.3. to address the bodies of the Organization with inquiries and proposals on issues related to the activities of the Organization and to receive responses;

4.5.1.4. to appeal against decisions, actions, and inaction of the governing bodies of the Organization, to submit applications, objections, and complaints against decisions made by them to the Board, and to demand consideration of complaints and applications at the General Meeting.

4.5.1.5. appeal against decisions of the General Meeting to the court.

4.5.1.6. receive information on the activities of the Organization;

4.5.1.7. apply to the bodies of the Organization for assistance in protecting their rights and legitimate interests;

4.5.1.8. to freely defend and promote ideas and proposals on issues discussed in the Organization before making decisions on these issues;

4.5.1.9. to freely withdraw from the Organization upon their own written application.

4.5.2. Members of the Organization shall be obliged to:

4.5.2.1. comply with the Statute of the Organization;

4.5.2.2. to execute decisions of the governing bodies of the Organization;

4.5.2.3. timely pay entrance and membership fees in the amounts and within the terms established by the Board of the Organization;

4.5.2.4. to contribute to the implementation of the tasks of the Organization;

4.5.2.5. participate in public events organized by the Organization.

4.6. Membership in the Organization shall be terminated in the following cases:

4.6.1. withdrawal from the Organization of one's own free will;

4.6.2. expulsion from the Organization, by the decision of the Board, due to violation of the requirements of this Statute, or if the member's activities contradict the purpose and objectives of the Organization, or if the member has lost contact with the Organization without good reason or for systematic non-payment of membership fees;

4.6.3. death of a member of the Organization.

4.7. Withdrawal from the Organization is carried out upon a written application of a member of the Organization addressed to the Head of the Board. Membership in the public association is terminated from the submission date of such an application and does not require additional decisions.

4.8. Grounds for exclusion from membership in the Organization:

- repeated violations of the requirements of the Statute;
- failure to participate in the activities of the Organization in person or through a representative for at least 12 (twelve) months;
- failure to pay membership fees during the last year.

4.9. The Board of the Organization shall decide the issue of expulsion by a majority vote of its members.

4.10. A member of the Organization shall not have the right to vote when the General Meeting of the Organization decides on the execution of a transaction and a dispute between him/her and the Organization.

GOVERNING BODIES OF THE ORGANIZATION

5.1. The Organization shall be managed based on democracy, publicity, election of governing bodies, subordination, and executive discipline, taking into account the regulatory documents of the Organization.

5.2. The governing bodies of the Organization shall be The General Meeting of Members, the Board of the Organization, and the Head of the Organization. Meetings of the governing bodies of the Organization (General Meeting, Board) may be held with the direct participation of members (their authorized representatives by proxy) and via Internet connection using audiovisual computer programs for online conferences.

The Board of the Organization shall make the decision on the form of holding such a meeting and shall notify the members of the Organization of the decision taken ten days before the date of such a meeting (General Meeting, Board).

A protocol shall document any meeting of the governing bodies. The form of the meeting shall be indicated in the minutes: if the meeting was held via the Internet, the minutes shall indicate which computer program was used to conduct the meeting.

5.3. The General Meeting of Members of the Organization (hereinafter referred to as the General Meeting) is the supreme body of the Organization, which has the right to make decisions on any issues of its activities, including those within the competence of the Board.

5.3.1. Members of the Organization attend the General Meeting in person or through an authorized representative by proxy. Each member of the Organization has one vote. The meeting shall be deemed valid if a majority of the members of the Organization attend it.

5.3.2. The regular General Meeting shall be convened by the Board annually. The relevant decision, indicating the date, time, place, and issues to be discussed, shall be communicated to the members of the Organization by 30 days before the date of the General Meeting. The General Meeting shall consider the issues submitted for its consideration by the Board, the Head of the Organization, as well as the members of the Organization.

5.3.3 The Management Board shall convene the Extraordinary General Meeting in the event of circumstances affecting the essential interests of the Organization, as well as in other cases provided for by this Charter and the legislation of Ukraine, within 30 days from the date of occurrence of the relevant circumstances. In this case, the decision of the Board of the Organization, indicating the date, time, place, and issues to be discussed, shall be communicated to the members of the Organization no later than 14 days before the date of the meeting of the General Meeting.

5.3.4. Not less than one-tenth of the members of the Organization shall have the right to initiate the convening of an extraordinary General Meeting before the Board. If the request of the members of the Organization to convene the General Meeting is not fulfilled, these members shall have the right to convene the General Meeting themselves.

5.3.5. The following issues shall be within the exclusive competence of the General Meeting:

5.3.5.1. Determination of the main activities of the Organization, Approval of its plans, and reports on their implementation.

5.3.5.2. Introduction and Approval of amendments to the constituent documents of the Organization, information about the Organization.

5.3.5.3. Approval of samples of seals, stamps, symbols, and other samples of the Organization's requisites.

5.3.5.4. Deciding on the termination of the Organization's activities.

5.3.5.5. Election of the liquidation commission and approval of the liquidation balance sheet.

- 5.3.5.6. Election of the Board of the Organization and recall of the Board or individual members of the Board.
- 5.3.5.7. Election and recall of the Head of the Organization.
- 5.3.5.8. Determining the procedure and methods for exercising the right of ownership and exercising control over its exercise.
- 5.3.6. Resolutions of the General Meeting shall be deemed adopted if a majority of the participants present at the General Meeting have voted for them. On the issues provided for in clauses 5.3.5.2 and 5.3.5.4, the resolution of the General Meeting shall be deemed adopted if at least three-fourths of the participants of the General Meeting voted for it. Also, three-fourths of the votes of the members of the Organization shall be cast to decide on the alienation of the property of the Organization in the amount of fifty percent or more of the property of the Organization.
- 5.3.7. A person from among the members elected by the General Meeting as the Chairman of the meeting shall preside at the meetings of the General Meeting. The proceedings of the General Meeting shall be recorded. The minutes of the General Meeting shall be kept by the Secretary of the General Meeting, who shall be elected by the General Meeting and shall be signed by the Chairman and the Secretary of the General Meeting.
- 5.3.8. The General Meeting shall adopt resolutions that shall be drawn up in the form of minutes of the meeting of the General Meeting. Resolutions adopted by the General Meeting in compliance with the requirements of this Charter, internal documents, and the legislation of Ukraine shall be binding on all other governing bodies of the Organization and its members. Resolutions adopted by the General Meeting shall take effect from the moment of their adoption unless otherwise determined by the General Meeting.
- 5.4. The Board of the Organization** is the governing body of the Organization for the period between the General Meetings, is elected for a term of 2 years, and performs the functions of managing its current organizational activities.
- 5.4.1 The Board is accountable to the General Meeting and organizes the implementation of its decisions. The Management Board shall act on behalf of the Organization within the limits provided for by this Statute, internal documents, and applicable law.
- 5.4.2. The Chairman of the Board is the Head of the Organization.
- 5.4.3. The structure of the Management Board, its composition, and the administrative functions of each of its members shall be approved by the General Meeting. The members of the Board shall be accountable to the General Meeting and shall be responsible to it for the activities of the Organization and the proper performance of their duties. The Board reports to the members of the Organization at the General Meeting of the Organization.
- 5.4.4. The competence of the Board shall include:
- 5.4.4.1. Organization of the implementation of decisions of the General Meeting.
- 5.4.4.2. Convocation of the General Meeting and formation of its agenda, preparation of materials on the agenda, preliminary consideration of all issues within the competence of the meeting, and preparation of draft resolutions on these issues for the meeting.
- 5.4.4.3. Preparing and submitting recommendations to the General Meeting on determining the main directions of the Organization's activities, approving plans and reports on their implementation, and other proposals on the Organization's activities.
- 5.4.4.4. Approval of current plans of the Organization's activities and measures necessary for their implementation;
- 5.4.4.5. Exercise certain property management functions by decision of the General Meeting of Members of the Organization.
- 5.4.4.6. Prepare annual reports on the activities of the Organization, including on the attraction and use of funds and property of the Organization; reports on the implementation of programs and projects of the Organization and submit them for approval by the General Meeting.
- 5.4.4.7. Resolve other issues, except for those within the exclusive competence of the General Meeting.
- 5.4.5. The Chairman of the Organization shall preside at the Board meetings.

5.4.6. All issues within the competence of the Management Board shall be resolved collectively at Management Board meetings. The Management Board shall hold regular and extraordinary meetings. The Head of the Organization convenes regular meetings, but not less than once every three months. Members of the Management Board shall be notified of the time, place, and agenda of the meeting ten days prior to the meeting. The Head of the Organization shall convene extraordinary meetings at the initiative of one-third of the members of the Board or directly at the request of the majority of the members of the Board. A meeting of the Management Board shall be deemed competent if a majority of its members are present.

5.4.7. Each member of the Management Board may take the initiative to make decisions on any issues within the competence of the Management Board.

5.4.8. Meetings of the Management Board shall be attended by its members in person or through an authorized representative by proxy. Resolutions of the Management Board shall be adopted by voting by a majority of votes present. Each member of the Management Board has one vote. In case of a tie, the vote of the Head of the Organization is decisive.

5.5. The Chairman of the Organization shall carry out operational management of the affairs, property, and funds of the Organization within the limits established by this Statute, the General Meeting, and the Management Board and, within his/her competence and authority, shall ensure the implementation of their decisions.

5.5.1. The Chairman of the Organization shall be elected and dismissed by the General Meeting every two years, shall be accountable to the General Meeting and controlled by the Board of the Organization, shall be the Chairman of the Board ex officio and shall have the right to submit proposals to the General Meeting and the Board of the Organization on any aspect of the Organization's activities.

5.5.2. The Chairman of the Organization:

5.5.2.1. Act on behalf of the Organization without a power of attorney and represent the Organization in its relations with other persons.

5.5.2.2. Issue orders, instructions, other internal regulations, and Organization documents.

5.5.2.3. Organize document flow, office work, accounting, and reporting of the Organization.

5.5.2.4. Hire, transfer to another job, suspend and dismiss employees of the Organization, apply incentives and penalties to them, approve job responsibilities of employees of the Organization.

5.5.2.5. Act as a manager of the Organization's funds and property, conclude and sign on behalf of the Organization economic and other agreements and contracts, and issue powers of attorney for the right to act and represent on behalf of the Organization.

5.5.2.6. Organize the preparation of meetings of the Management Board.

5.5.2.7. Resolve other issues of the Organization's activities in accordance with the purpose and main tasks of its activities within its competence by the internal documents of the Organization and this Statute, make any other decisions on these issues or perform any other actions other than those within the competence of other governing bodies of the Organization, the Board, and the General Meeting of Members of the Organization.

5.5.2.8. Report on its work and the work of the Board to the General Meeting of the Organization at the next General Meeting.

5.5.3. The decision of the Head of the Organization shall be formalized in the form of orders or instructions.

5.5.4. Reporting is carried out at the regular General Meeting. Extraordinary reporting is carried out at the request of at least one-third of the members of the Organization.

5.5.5. The Chairman of the Organization may be removed from office by a decision of the General Meeting on the initiative of a majority of the members of the Board before the expiration of the term for which he was elected in the following cases:

- at his request based on a written application submitted to the Board of the Organization;
- in case of repeated violation of the requirements of the Charter of the Organization;
- if their actions caused material or moral damage to the Organization.

5.5.6. If the Head of the Organization cannot take up his/her duties for more than 6 (six) months, the Board of the Organization shall convene an Extraordinary General Meeting to discuss the situation and the issue of the Organization's management.

SUPERVISORY BOARD

6.1. The Supervisory Board shall be an advisory and controlling body of the Organization and shall audit its financial and economic activities in case of more than ten members of the Organization.

6.2. The Supervisory Board is accountable only to the General Meeting of the Organization.

6.3. The General Meeting shall approve the personal composition of the Supervisory Board. A member of the Supervisory Board may not be a member of the Board or the Head of the Organization at the same time.

6.4. The Supervisory Board shall be elected from among the members of the Organization consisting of the Chairman of the Board and two members of the Board for a term of two years. The Chairman of the Supervisory Board is proposed for approval by the members of the Supervisory Board at the General Meeting of the Organization.

6.5. The powers of the Supervisory Board shall include:

- making proposals on financial activities and use of the Organization's assets;
- drawing up conclusions on the financial activities and use of the Organization's assets prior to the approval by the General Meeting of annual budgets, balance sheets, financial and other reports of the governing bodies of the Organization
- conducting audits of the financial and economic activities of the Organization;
- submitting reports of audits and inspections to the General Meeting for making appropriate decisions;
- initiating the convening of an extraordinary General Meeting;
- approving the annual plan of activities of the Supervisory Board.

6.6. The Supervisory Board is headed by the Chairman, who:

- manages the work of the Supervisory Board;
- convenes the Supervisory Board for regular and extraordinary meetings;
- signs the documentation prepared based on the Supervisory Board's work results.

6.7. The Supervisory Board shall be competent if a majority of its members participate in its work. A majority of votes of the Supervisory Board members present at the meeting shall adopt resolutions. In case of equality of votes, the vote of the Chairman of the Supervisory Board shall be decisive.

6.8. Members of the Supervisory Board shall have the right to participate in the meeting of the Management Board of the Organization in an advisory capacity.

PROCEDURE FOR APPEALING AGAINST DECISIONS, ACTIONS, INACTION OF THE GOVERNING BODIES OF THE ORGANIZATION AND CONSIDERATION OF COMPLAINTS

7.1. Decisions, actions, and inaction of the governing bodies of the Organization may be appealed by a member (members) of the Organization.

7.1.1. An initial complaint against actions, inaction, or decisions of the Head of the Organization/ Chairperson of the Board shall be submitted to the Board, which is obliged to consider the complaint at the next meeting, with the obligatory summoning of the complaining member of the public association, as well as the Head of the Organization/ Chairperson of the Board whose actions, inaction or decisions are being appealed. If the Board rejects the complaint, a repeated complaint is submitted to the General Meeting, which is obliged to consider the complaint at a regular or extraordinary meeting, with the obligatory summons of the complaining member and

the Head of the Organization / Chairman of the Board whose action, inaction or decision is being appealed.

7.1.2. Initial complaint about actions, inaction, or decisions of a member of the Board is submitted to the Head of the Organization / Chairman of the Board, who is obliged to consider the complaint within 20 working days, with the obligatory summons of the complaining member of the public association, as well as the member of the Board whose actions, inaction or decision is appealed. In case the complaint is rejected by the Head of the Organization/ Chairperson of the Board, a repeated complaint is submitted to the General Meeting, which is obliged to consider the complaint at a regular or extraordinary meeting, with the obligatory summons of the complaining member and the member of the Board whose action, inaction or decision is being appealed. A complaint requiring consideration at an Extraordinary General Meeting shall be the basis for convening such a General Meeting within thirty days from the date of receipt of such a complaint.

7.1.3. A complaint against actions, inaction, or decisions of the General Meeting of the Organization shall be filed with the court in accordance with the current legislation at the time of appealing such actions, inaction, or decisions.

7.2. The decisions and actions (inaction) that may be appealed include decisions within the management activities of the governing bodies of the Organization, as a result of which:

7.2.1. The rights and/or legitimate interests or freedoms of a member of the Organization (group of members of the Organization) are violated.

7.2.2. Obstacles have been created for a member of the Organization to exercise its rights and/or legitimate interests or freedoms.

7.2.3. Unlawful imposition of obligations on a member of the Organization or unlawful disciplinary liability.

INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION

8.1. The Organization, in accordance with its statutory tasks, has the right to carry out international relations and activities in the manner prescribed by this Statute and the current legislation of Ukraine.

8.2. The international activity of the Organization is carried out through participation in international projects and work of international organizations, as well as other forms that do not contradict the legislation of Ukraine, norms, and principles of international law.

8.3. In carrying out its international activities, the Organization enjoys the full range of rights and obligations of a legal entity.

8.4. The Organization shall:

8.4.1. organize the exchange of delegations, organize tournaments, competitions, conferences, exhibitions, and fairs with the participation of foreign partners, send its representatives to participate in relevant events outside Ukraine;

8.4.2. conduct research jointly with foreign organizations by the areas of its activities, publish their results;

8.4.3. implement other joint programs and projects with the participation of foreign partners and international organizations that do not contradict the current legislation of Ukraine.

SEPARATE DIVISIONS OF THE ORGANIZATION

9.1. The Organization may have separate subdivisions that are not legal entities and are formed by the decision of the General Meeting of the Organization.

9.2. The Statute of the Organization shall govern separate subdivisions of the Organization in their activities.

9.3. The General Meeting shall appoint the heads of separate subdivisions of the Organization for a term of 2 years and act based on a power of attorney. The heads of separate subdivisions must be members of the Organization.

9.4. Separate subdivisions shall have the following authorities:

9.4.1. Represent the Organization within the territory covered by their authorities.

9.4.2. Implement the statutory purpose and tasks of the Organization within the territory covered by their powers, according to the powers granted by the decision of the general meeting.

9.4.3. Work on attracting new members using means not prohibited by Ukrainian legislation.

9.5. The head of a separate subdivision has the right to:

9.5.1. To make decisions on the use of the name and symbols of the Organization for the implementation of the tasks of the Organization.

9.5.2. To apply to the governing bodies of the Organization for assistance in the realization of the Organization's tasks.

9.5.3. To attend meetings of the Board of the Organization (without the right to vote).

9.5.4. To apply with petitions to the governing bodies of the Organization.

9.6. The head of a separate subdivision is obliged to:

9.6.1. Comply with the requirements of the Statute of the Organization.

9.6.2. Execute legal and adopted decisions within the requirements of the Charter of the Organization of the governing bodies of the Organization.

9.6.3. To avoid actions aimed at violating the honor and dignity of members (participants) of the Organization.

9.7. The activity of a separate subdivision may be terminated by its closure by the decision of the General Meeting of the Organization.

9.8. The Organization shall notify the authorized state registration authority of the closure of a separate subdivision by the requirements of the current legislation of Ukraine.

9.9. The property and funds assigned to a separate subdivision after the termination of its activities shall be transferred directly to the Board until the General Meeting of the Organization makes a decision on the distribution of property and funds.

FUNDS AND PROPERTY OF THE ORGANIZATION.

10.1. The Organization is a non-entrepreneurial company. To carry out its program and statutory goals and objectives, the Organization may own funds, securities, property and non-property rights, tangible and intangible assets, equipment, transport, other means, and property, the acquisition of which is not prohibited by the current legislation of Ukraine.

10.2. The Organization independently and independently exercises the rights of ownership, use, and disposal of its property, funds, property, and non-property rights through its statutory bodies within their competence.

10.3. The property of the Organization shall consist of funds or property received free of charge or in the form of non-refundable financial assistance or voluntary donations, contributions of members of the Organization, passive income; grants or subsidies from the state or local budgets, as well as from state trust funds, financial support for programs (projects, activities) of the Organization at the expense of the state and local budgets, from the implementation of the state order; charitable, humanitarian and technical assistance, including in accordance with international treaties of Ukraine; acquired

10.4. It is prohibited to distribute the received income (profits) or a part thereof among the founders (participants within the meaning of the Civil Code of Ukraine), members of such Organization, employees (except for payment of their labor, accrual of a single social contribution), members of governing bodies and other related parties.

10.5. The income (profits) and property of the Organization shall be used exclusively to finance the expenses for the maintenance of the Organization, the realization of the purpose (goals, objectives), and activities determined by this Statute.

10.6. The Organization shall be liable for its obligations with all its property owned by it. The Organization shall not be responsible for the obligations of its members. Members shall not be responsible for the obligations of the Organization unless otherwise provided by law.

10.7. The Organization is obliged to keep accounting, statistical, tax, and financial statements, to be registered with the fiscal authorities, and to pay taxes and fees to the budget in the manner and the amounts provided for by law. The Organization shall be obliged to keep all necessary accounting documents related to domestic and international transactions for at least five years.

10.8. Executive authorities and local self-government bodies shall exercise state supervision and control over compliance with the law by the Organization in accordance with the procedure established by the legislation of Ukraine.

PROCEDURE FOR AMENDING THE CHARTER

11.1. The charter and the current legislation of Ukraine determine the procedure for amending the charter.

11.2. The decision of the General Meeting shall approve amendments to this Statute if at least 3/4 of the members of the Organization present voted for it. The authorized registration authority shall be notified of the changes made to the statutory documents.

TERMINATION OF THE ORGANIZATION'S ACTIVITIES

12.1. The termination of the Organization's activities shall be carried out by a decision of the public association adopted by the General Meeting, by self-dissolution or reorganization, or by a court decision to ban (compulsory dissolution) the public association.

12.2. Termination of the activity of a public association with the status of a legal entity shall result in termination of the legal entity.

12.3 The Organization has the right to decide at any time to terminate its activities (self-dissolution).

12.4. The General Meeting shall make the decision to dissolve the Organization if at least three-fourths of the participants present at the General Meeting have voted for it. The General Meeting shall establish a liquidation commission or entrust the Board to exercise the powers of the liquidation commission to terminate the non-governmental Organization as a legal entity, as well as decide on the use of funds and property of the non-governmental Organization after its termination in accordance with the charter.

12.5. The decision of the General Meeting shall carry out the reorganization of the Organization if at least three-fourths of the participants of the General Meeting voted for it by merger, division, accession, or transformation.

12.6 The procedure and legal consequences of termination of the Organization's activities by self-dissolution, reorganization, or prohibition (compulsory dissolution) of the Organization shall be determined in accordance with this Statute and the current legislation of Ukraine.

12.7. The assets shall be transferred to one or more non-profit organizations of the relevant type or transferred to the budget in case of termination of a legal entity (as a result of its liquidation, merger, division, accession, or transformation).

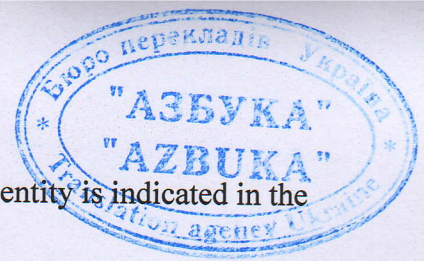

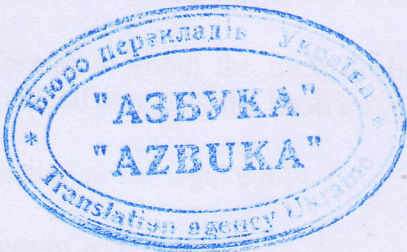

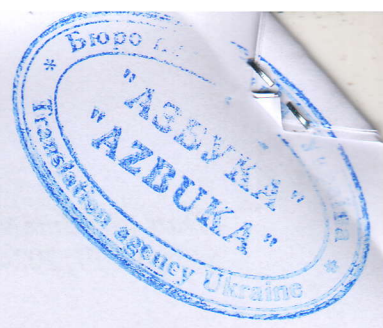
